

The participatory planning approach

The triangle & roadmap

In figure 10, 11 & 12 shown below you can see the participatory planning approach that will be used for this project. This approach is a combination of two participatory planning approaches that have been used in other project. The roadmap is a part of the World Food Programme and the triangle is designed by the Technical University of Hamburg (TU Hamburg) in Germany. These two approaches are combined

within this project, because the two approach reinforce each other.

The triangle, designed by the TU Hamburg, figure 13, is a general participatory planning approach that can be used in every country around the world. The triangle shows the different phases of a participatory planning approach. It also shows the level of participation and the amount of people that are involved in the process.

The roadmap, figure 13, is a participatory approach of the World Food Programme. This approach was designed for poor regions in the world, which also includes the townships of South Africa (World Food Programme, 2014). The roadmap reinforces the triangle, because it makes the approach more applicable in the townships in South Africa.

The roadmap describes more specifically what steps need to be taken within a participatory planning process in a township. The steps of the road map take place, as indicated with the arrows, within the different phases of the triangle.




Figure 14. The participatory planning approach used in this project. A combination of the roadmap (World Food Programme, 2014) and the triangle (TU Hamburg, 2010)
