## Project aims- for the 1st year midwifery student

- To explore the experiences and perspectives of the individual pregnant woman regarding the practice of maternity healthcare practitioners
- To experience active engagement and relational continuity
- To experience partnership
- To observe the interaction between the woman and the maternity healthcare practitioner
- To experience the individual continuum of the childbirth process through the eyes of the woman
- To support personal and professional development of critical thinking and reflective practice
- To be involved in research
- To enhance (in-depth) learning experiences and student satisfaction

## Assessment competency domains

## Students' activities (80 hour study load)

- Recruit a pregnant woman (consent and behavioural code)
- Attendance of a minimum of 5 prenatal and one postnatal visit (birth is optional) – cycle: 'interview - participant / observation - evaluation - reflection'
- Attendance of the woman's multi-agency care participant / observation
- 4 lectures and SPPS workshop
- Logbook portfolio of competencies & best-practices, learning & development
- Client Centred Care Questionnaire
- Arts & crafted gift
