- ✓ Maybe link to the content of the lesson?






INCLUDED – YOUR VOICE IS OUR STRENGTH

This is important in the Netherlands, where the history of slavery is often overlooked despite its ongoing impact. During Black History Month, we celebrate the strength, pride, and influence of many generations. 17 February: Lunar New Year

In 2026, Ramadan will partly fall in February and partly in March. During this period, Muslims fast from sunrise to sunset. Iftar marks the time when they break their fast, often with family, friends or the wider community. This period is all about reflection, connection and solidarity. At RUAS, we regularly organise a communal iftar. It brings students, lecturers and staff together to help them get to know each other better and share traditions. Would you like to join us?

World Autism Day





Mental Health Awareness Month shines a spotlight on mental health and breaks down the taboos surrounding psychological differences. For the INCLUDED team, this month is all about neurodiversity in education because no two brains are the same! While this can present challenges, it also offers valuable perspectives. This month, we are discussing neurodiversity and celebrating the strengths of different minds.

17 May: International Day against Homophobia, Biphobia, Intersex phobia and Transphobia (IDAHOBIT)

Did you know that we celebrate IDAHOBIT every year on 17 May? On this day in 1990, homosexuality was officially removed from the list of diseases. It's a chance for people all over the world to speak out against homophobia, biphobia, intersex phobia and transphobia, and to demand respect, equality and the freedom to be yourself. Here in the Netherlands, the LGBTQI+ community is often referred to as the rainbow community. That stands for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and intersex. The plus sign represents other genders and sexual orientations, like asexuality and non-binary identities. We're adding more concepts to help people understand and express their identities. So, what we're saying is that everyone should be respected for who they are.

26 May: Eid al-Adha (Islamic Celebration))

Eid al-Adha is an important Islamic festival during which Muslims reflect on the story of the Prophet Ibrahim, who was prepared to sacrifice his son for God. They gather for prayer, share meals with family and neighbours, and donate to charity.

16 June: Neuro Diversity Pride Day

20 June: World Refugee Day

Everyone deserves a safe place to call home. On World Refugee Day on 20 June, we recognise the strength and courage of those who flee their homeland. It is a day to listen to their stories, support them, and work together to create a world where everyone feels welcome and secure.

30 June and 1 July: Keti Koti

Keti Koti, which means 'broken chains', commemorates the abolition of slavery in Suriname and the Caribbean parts of the Kingdom. It is a time for reflection and celebration, looking back and looking ahead. At RUAS, we reflect on this important history because recognition and awareness form the basis of a just and inclusive society. Every year on 30 June, the Rotterdam commemoration takes place at the Slavery Monument on the Lloydkade, close to our Rotterdam Mainport Institute (RMI) location. During the commemoration, our Chair of the Executive Board and a student representative from Rotterdam UAS lay a wreath.

1 July: Keti Koti

On 1 July, Rotterdam celebrates Keti Koti, commemorating the abolition of slavery in Suriname and the Caribbean in 1863. The day celebrates resilience and freedom, and focuses on solidarity within the Afro-Surinamese and Caribbean communities. The day begins with the Bigi Spikri parade, a vibrant celebration of cultural pride, tradition and community. Starting at Oostervant, the parade moves to Wijkpark Het Oude Westen, where the Keti Koti Festival comes to life with music, dance, children's activities and much more.

5 July: Cape Verdi Independence Day

On 5 July, Cape Verdeans around the world celebrate their country's independence. It is a day full of pride, music, dance and stories!

14 July: International Day of the Non Binary Persons

This day is dedicated to visibility, awareness and support for people who do not (fully) identify as male or female. Since 2012, it has grown to become an important moment of solidarity and recognition.

15 August: Commemoration of World War II in the former Dutch East Indies

Commemorations of the Second World War in the former Netherlands East Indies focus on the region's victims and the war's impact. Ultimately, the war's end led to Indonesia's independence. Indonesia declared its independence on 17 August 1945, and this day has been celebrated annually as Hari Proklamasi Kemerdekaan ever since. However, the Netherlands did not officially recognise Indonesia's independence until 27 December 1949, following a violent war of decolonisation. In 2023, the Netherlands recognised 17 August 1945 as Indonesia's independence date.

17 August: Día di Tula

This day commemorates the courageous uprising of thousands of enslaved people in Curaçao, led by the resistance hero Tula, on 17 August 1795. It is a celebration of freedom, and resistance against injustice.

27 August: Chung Yuan feest (China)

Zhong Yuan Festival, also known as the Hungry Ghost Festival is an important Chinese festival when deceased ancestors are honoured both in Taoist and Buddhist beliefs. It is a time for remembrance and respect, and for families to come together and share love and gratitude.
